Mario Castillo is entering his eleventh year of coaching football at the high school level. Coach Castillo has served as an assistant coach for the Rancho Mirage High School Rattler's Football Team since its inaugural year. This year, Coach Castillo is proud to serve as the J.V. Football Team's Head Coach and Defensive Coordinator. He will also reprise his role as the Varsity Team's Defensive Line Coach.

Coach Castillo was born and raised in the Coachella Valley.
