SSC Business a. Approval of Minutes	Action Item: Approval of minutes for 2.1.23;Sarah Robles, SSC Chairperson	Agenda was reviewed , but due to lack of quorum, we couldn't vote to approve them at this time
Budget a. Monitoring of SPSA Budget	Informational: Teresa Haga, Ed.D., Principal	All money for this fiscal year was spent. SPSA for next year goes for board approval in April. Any changes will be addressed in the May meeting.
5. WASC	Athena Martinez O'Grady	Presentation by Mrs. Martinez O'Grady. WASC here in February 2024 and we need to put together a big report. March 22 will be a staff meeting into WASC focus groups. WASC focuses on our strengths and areas that require improvement for accreditation focus areas (RMHS) and 4 goals (from WASC last visit). Report is available on the school's website. Our goal is to reduce the number of focus areas. We have seen increase in English, decease in Math see 9 focus areas on the school site. (ELD increases one level, ELL increases proficiency, Increase proficiency in Math, use of consistent data analysis to drive instruction, positive and uniform enforcement of school rules and policies, collaborate and analyze data of students' progress, increase student and parent voice, improve communication protocols). First two chapters(out of 5) are written (by Mrs. Martinez O'Grady) and will be shared with SSC for feedback
6. 2023-2024 LCAP Input	Action Item: SSC Members and guests	■ 3 main goals set by the district, Dr. Haga (and the district) asking for input from SSC: (1) academic achievement of students- need more bilingual paraprofessionals. varsity tutors suggested by Dre. Omier, add class options like additional art options, add ROTC (?). (2) parent involvement- Dr. Omier suggested making links available for parent resources like English classes, PTA (?), dring validation at the beginning of year, heavily promote parent meeting to get things started and target parents because

		this is one of the few days when many parents actually come to school and could be reached directly. Welcome back orientation Feed parents when they come to meetings(? federal guidelines might not allow). We need to figure out what is keeping parents from comingprotocol used to be to meet with parents at the beginning of year. Maybe make attendance to parent meetings once a month or every other month a requirement for students to remain in programs like AVID, Culinary, RACE, etc to start bringing parents in. (3) students safety/mental health- having physical rather than virtual (EduGuide) interactions with students. This will give a chance to get to know students and teachers better. Mrs. Sandoval brought ideas for a mental health unit to do with students. Increase the amount of mental health support personnel around the district. Overwhelmed system limits the amount of available services, following up with students, and more meaningful treatment. Most parents don't have resources to pay for mental health services for their students. Increase security personnel at school. This can increase the effectiveness of preventive actions rather than reactive actions.
